Education

- 6,900 students enrolled in 6 colleges from undergraduate students to post-doctoral fellows
- 1129 residents in Colleges of Dentistry, Medicine and Veterinary Medicine.
- 13% of all UF students; 32% of graduate/professional students
- Education programs throughout state
- Competitive academic programs based on demand, faculty experience and national board scores
- Professional degrees in Audiology (AuD), Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing Practice (DNP), Physical Therapy (DPT), Pharmacy, Veterinary Medicine

Research

- \$291M in research awards/grants, FY08
- 52% of total UF research awards
- Royalty and licensing income is \$47+M
- Public Health and Health Professions ranked #1 in U.S. for FY07 NIH Research Funding compared to peer colleges
- Dentistry in top 12% and Pharmacy in upper quartile of FY08 NIH Research funding
- Veterinary Medicine ranked 11th in US News & World Report
- Major Interdisciplinary Research Centers:
 - McKnight Brain Institute
 - UF Shands Cancer Center
 - UF Genetics Institute
 - UF Institute on Aging
 - UF Emerging Pathogens Institute
- Promising areas: Stem cell biology, gene therapy, bioterrorism and emerging, transplantation, bioimaging

Patient Care

- Patient care provided primarily in Gainesville and Jacksonville
- Over 74,000 patient admissions; 18,700 animal admissions; 1 million outpatient clinic visits
- All colleges have patient care component; largest is in College of Medicine
- Patient care venues in faculty clinics throughout state, Veteran’s Affairs Medical Centers, partnerships with hospitals, primarily Shands HealthCare
- Trauma 1 Center designation in Gainesville and Jacksonville
- Shands Cancer Hospital slated to open September 2009
- Florida Proton Therapy Institute in Jacksonville, 1 of 5 in US
- Strategic patient care priorities: cancer, genetics, neurosciences, children and transplantation, and cardiovascular disease
