Education

- Acknowledged as having one of the strongest medical education programs in North America.
- Among the first medical schools in the U.S. to develop the Human Patient Simulator and use standardized patients for clinical skills evaluation.
- Recognized for pioneering a model of an interprofessional medical education, and promoting early student involvement in interdisciplinary, system-based learning.
- Student support services (financial, personal, and career counseling) highly rated by student body.
- State of the art informational system to allow longitudinal data collection of student performances, and faculty and course evaluations.
- Robust MD/PhD program to develop physician scientists
- Undergraduate and graduate medical curriculum anchored in the development of competencies emphasizing humanism, leading to a culture of professionalism.

Research

- College of Medicine obtained 41.8% of UF's total extramural research awards for FY 2007-08.
- Biomedical Science Building scheduled to open in June 2009 resulting in 85,000 net sq ft of new research space
- 211 postdoctoral scholars
- Participation in National Institute of Child Health, NIH, National Children's Study - \$9M contract for 5 years
- Establishment of the Emerging Pathogens Institute scheduled to open in October 2009, fusing key disciplines for outreach, education and research to help preserve Florida's health and economy.
- Partnering agreement with Moffitt, UF and Shands to improve cancer care.

Patient Care

- Faculty account for approximately 480,000 physician visits and 40,000 discharges annually.
- Berlin Heart device implanted in child, first in Florida. Subsequent heart transplant successful.
- Shands Cancer Hospital, a 192-bed hospital, broke ground in February 2007; scheduled to open September 2009
- Installation of robotic daVinci surgical system to complement existing expertise in minimally invasive surgery
- The Florida Proton Therapy Institute, located next to Shands Jacksonville, is one of only five proton therapy treatment centers in the US, delivering a highly precise and effective form of radiation to destroy tumors with little or no damage to adjacent healthy tissues.
- Strategic recruitments in cardiothoracic surgery, urology, cancer, and geriatrics
- Programmatic strength lies in cancer, neurosciences, aging, gene therapy, transplantation and children's services.
