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## Research

PHHP is ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in the nation in NIH awards among colleges of health professions.

With \$15.3 million in external awards for FY07-08, PHHP ranks 5<sup>th</sup> among UF's 16 colleges.

PHHP is home to three federally-funded research centers, the Center for the Study of Emotion and Attention, the Florida Center on Disability and Health, and the Senator Paul Wellstone Muscular Dystrophy Cooperative Research Center.

## Patient Care

The communicative disorders department provides speech, language, and audiology services for Shands Healthcare and is expanding clinics at Hampton Oaks, Shands at AGH, and Magnolia Park.

The clinical and health psychology department provides psychological services for the entire Health Science Center.

The occupational and physical therapy departments provide assessments and treatment throughout multiple school districts and at Tacachale for individuals with developmental disabilities.

The Florida Chartbook on Disability and Health, available online through the Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics, summarizes disability and health statistics for Floridians compared to the nation.

## Education

PHHP is comprised of seven departments: behavioral science and community health, clinical and health psychology, communicative disorders, epidemiology and biostatistics, health services research, management and policy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy. The college also has divisions of rehabilitation counseling and environmental health.

PHHP offers three interdisciplinary degree programs: the bachelor of health science, master of public health and PhD in rehabilitation science.

Eighty-one percent of the Bachelor of Health Science students who applied to graduate or professional school in 2008 were accepted.

The Master of Health Administration Program received the 2008 Higher Education Award from the American College of Healthcare Executives.

The Department of Clinical and Health Psychology received the 2007 American Psychological Association's Award for Culture of Service in the Psychological Science.

The College enrolled its first six students in the new Epidemiology and Biostatistics PhD programs.
